## Lecture Title | Empowering Women to Lead in a Changing World

## **Abstract**

Saudi Arabia is in a new era that is embracing knowledge and innovation to drive social change, accelerate economic development, and improve its global position in the world. The country cannot succeed unless it prioritizes and empowers women as leaders in the workforce. The country knows this, and is making significant reforms. The 2020 to 2030 decade will be one of human capital development for the Kingdom, and women are central to its success. With the aim of increasing their participation in the workforce by nearly 10%, there is much work ahead, but strong gains have also been made. Empowering Women to Lead in a Changing World discusses where we are in the historic effort to bring women into the national conversation and into leadership positions. It considers potential blind spots inherent in such undertakings, and offers suggestions on how to navigate the immense barrier - while also recognizing the unprecedented opportunities that this new era brings, particularly as the country reaches its youth population peak this year. The talk explores matters unique to Saudi Arabia, while bringing a global perspective to the common issues in the worldwide push for women's inclusion and empowerment. It looks at KAUST as model for the Kingdom and explores ways in which the university has contributed to the national vision, managed change to build a unique culture and community marked by excellence, and can serve as a model as other Saudi institutions prioritize women's empowerment and leadership for the 21st century.
