



When does AIDS occur?

It is caused by the human immunodeficiency virus, which infects a type of white blood cell responsible for the immune system and leads to its destruction.





What are the methods of transmission of infection?





What are the symptoms?

Primary infection:

Symptoms usually appear within a month or two of the viruses entering the body and are like influenza symptoms.

Clinical infection:

At this stage, symptoms may not appear at all for a period ranging between 8-10 years.



What are the symptoms of HIV (AIDS)?

Failure to detect the disease and not receiving treatment leads to the appearance of chronic symptoms, including:





What are the testing procedures at voluntary HIV testing centers?



Examination and consultation are completely confidential.



The examination is done by taking a sample of blood or saliva.



Obtain patient approval before reporting the result.



Transfer to confirmatory testing upon request



The examination is not performed without the approval of the patient.



No personal data or name of patient is taken.



Test results appear within five minutes.



Give the patient enough time to discuss and ask questions.


Can I live a normal life?
