1. Launch of Five Training Courses in Al and Road Modeling at IAU for Trainees from all regions of Saudi Arabia

Five training courses in artificial intelligence (AI) for traffic safety have been launched in precedence to the launch of the Sixth International Traffic Safety Forum and Exhibition, which will be inaugurated by His Royal Highness Prince Saud bin Nayef bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, Governor of the Eastern Province, tomorrow, Monday, and will continue for three days under the title: "The Usage of AI and Data Analysis to improve traffic movement and traffic safety on the road network." The Chairman of the Saudi Traffic Safety Society, Dr. Abdul Hamid Al-Mojil, stated that these 5 training courses were launched at the College of Engineering at IAU, these courses tackled: artificial intelligence, big data, driving driverless cars, and two courses on simulation and modeling programs for the network and road traffic flow. The total number of people registered in these courses reached about 520 male and female trainees from all regions of the Kingdom, and from the concerned authorities in transportation and traffic and universities.

And the skill program includes two courses which are decision-making and initiative.
